History: Richard Gaines Russell died July 22, 2011, a victim of metastatic melanoma. He was 49 years old and led a 17-person software development team for Microsoft. He built his first computer from a kit at age 14.

Richard attended college at ACU and graduated from MSU. He majored in Engineering Physics at ACU 1980-1982, and in Computer Science at MSU, with graduation in May 1989. This Scholarship is to assist students in either of these two programs during their senior year with the expenses of that year, to include graduate hours, tuition, and graduate school application expenses.

Criteria: Student should apply in last semester of junior year; 3.5 Cumulative GPA. Midwestern State University student pursuing a computer science degree OR Abilene Christian University student pursuing an Engineering Physics degree. This is a one-time scholarship award of \$3,500

Deadline for application: Juniors apply by March 15. Award will be for senior year.
